Commodore's Column December 2014

Our well attended AGM last month celebrated the club's and its members' achievements over the last year, thanks to everyone who came, for those who were unable to attend here is a brief summary of my report.

 Over the last year the club has enjoyed continued success, our lake has been busy with established sailors, new members and visitors to our various open events.



- Early in the year much hard work was involved in the development of our ladies changing facilities; the results are clear for everyone to see.
- Six new RYA Dinghy Instructors were trained at the club earlier this year to support our coaching programme.
- Our various race series, including our informal Lazy Sunday races, have been well supported – congratulations to all those who received prizes.
- Junior training, through our Pirate and Buccaneer groups, junior windsurfing sessions and our junior summer course, goes from strength to strength, extra sessions were run this year to satisfy demand!
- RYA Level 1 courses were run, training sailors and recruiting new club members, and dinghy mentoring for club members, adult windsurfing sessions and Powerboat courses were all provided by our hardworking volunteer coaches.

- During the year we launched a new website for the club, which includes a live webcam and weather station and WiFi was installed at the club.
- Another Sport England grant was obtained this year after a successful bid. An award of £10,000 was made to enable us to buy an additional RIB to support the club's activities. In fact we bought two! The extra one to replace one of our older boats.



- Late season events included a very well supported Bart's Bash, our Lay Up BBQ (with spectacular fireworks!) and a visit to Haversham Sailing Club by a group of junior sailors to compete in Topper regatta (see below). All were great club events enjoyed by those who took part.
- The club continues to be well supported by a large group of willing volunteers, without whom our club would not be able to function. Rescue boats are driven, food is prepared, groups are coached, boats, buildings and computers are maintained, and committee decisions are taken. Thanks to everyone who has worked so hard over the year.

Other business at the AGM included some updating of our Constitution and a statement from our treasurer, Mark Roe, who was able to report that the club's finances are in good order and as such no increases in our club's membership fees were proposed for 2015.

Whilst they weren't ready for the water, our new RIBs were 'on show' at the AGM. I'm pleased to report that both boats have now been commissioned and duly run in and are now ready for service. Refresher sessions will be run for our safety boat team early in the New Year and any PSC members who would like to undertake the two day RYA Powerboat Level 2 course to enable them to join the team should contact me.



Male members will be pleased to know that two new

showers have been installed in our changing rooms, along with new lighting and PIRs.

Activity on the water has been reduced recently since the introduction of our winter restrictions at the start of November but there is still a group who regularly sail on Sunday mornings and your committee is certainly keeping busy by planning ahead for next year. The calendar looks very full for 2015 with our normal full schedule of races, social sailing events and training courses.



We are also developing a 'to do list' which includes upkeep of our club boats, more work on the men's changing room as well as other updating and maintenance tasks around the club – perhaps you should put the dates of next Spring's working parties in your diary now! (21st and 22nd February and 7th March).

I'd like to take this opportunity to wish all Priory Sailing Club members a very Happy Christmas. Here's to a happy, healthy and windy 2015!

PSC Juniors at Haversham Topper Open

On Saturday the 25th of October a group of nine young sailors from Priory made the journey to Haversham Sailing Club to compete in their annual Topper traveller event. This event is open for anyone to enter and was part of the Topper Traveller Series, attracting some of the best Topper sailors from across the Eastern region. The group of nine PSC junior sailors was the largest in recent times to go to the event. The range of experience was wide, with this being the first venture beyond



priory for Timmy Evans, Rory and Grace Caldwell and Ellie Aikman. The rest of the group consisted of Imogen and Nat Otley, Sonia Evans, David Stephenson and myself.

On arrival at Haversham everyone chipped in, and we quickly unloaded and rigged up the nine Toppers ready for what was going to be an exciting days sailing, with the wind forecast to pick up to around 15 knots by the afternoon. The first race started and no one got a particularly good start, David taking the lead of all the Priory sailors. The wind picked up part way through the race,



and with Timmy in a full sized topper rig, he did very well not to get blown away! David held on to the lead of our group all the way through the race, but unfortunately got disqualified for not going through the start gate on his second lap! This shows how one lapse in concentration can cost you an awful lot of places! The second race was more successful for all, at one point Priory sailors holding the places 2nd-7th. Another good race from David saw him again in the lead of our group, but an unfortunately timed capsize meant he lost three places on the line! Timmy went down to a 4.2 rig for this race,

and the stand-out performances of the morning were from him and Grace, who did extremely well given the blustery conditions. Imogen also gained a very well earned 7th, just beating Sonia and Ellie.

After a warming lunch, the wind increased and everyone was relishing the opportunity to get back on the water. Our starts were getting better and better; with David and I managing to break away from the main group, gaining a 3rd and 2nd respectively. Although one of the lightest sailors there, Nat's perseverance showed through, gaining another good result in the afternoon. This same perseverance showed from Rory, who, even though this was his first open event, was right behind some of the regulars. The final race was by far the windiest, and this meant there were many non-finishers, but no one gave up too easily. It was good to see everyone smiling throughout, even if they were capsized at the time! Even though everyone was cold and tired, we still managed to put the boats back on the trailer in record time thanks to a great PSC team effort, which was followed

by a quick prize giving. On return to Priory it was great to see everyone helping out once again when unpacking the boats, meaning we could all get home and have a nice hot drink!

For me, the two stand-out performances were David and Timmy. This is the best I have ever seen David sail, and he was very unlucky to not get in the top 3. Timmy was the most determined sailor on the water, (including the regional sailors) and never gave up, always smiling throughout the day. Overall everyone enjoyed the day very much, and thanks must go to Tim for organising our team, and to all the parents for coming out to support us, rigging and de rigging, loading and unloading. A great day was had by all.

Improving your dinghy sailing in the New Year

If you're keen to improve on your sailing in 2015, here are some options.

- 1. Talk to club and committee members at the club: they will be happy to help you. There are always folks around on Sunday mornings through to early afternoon, even in the depths of winter unless the lake is frozen solid! As the lake warms and the evenings get lighter this extends to Saturdays and Wednesday evenings.
- 2. I'll be offering informal coaching on Saturday mornings in May & June. Ideal if you've done Level 1 and want to build on that, or if you are just out of practice, or if there's something specific you'd like help working on.
- 3. Join in the racing. The last Sunday in each month from April on has Lazy Sunday races, from 2pm; these are for everyone, including juniors and novices who would like to try racing but are not confident they know how, or would just value the "during the race" coaching on offer.
- 4. Join the club racing, which takes place every Sunday morning. We're a friendly lot despite being competitive, and there's nothing like developing your sailing by watching how good sailors are doing it!
