Here's hoping that the sunny and breezy summer continues for us at PSC!



Club Racing at the Priory

The Spring season this year produced some really unusual results in that 12 different sailors had a first or second place in at least one race. Some excel in strong winds: Paul Williams & Tim Hewett (Lasers) and Lucie Hewett (Topper); some excel in medium winds: Will Armitage & Jim Thornett (Streakers). Among the Heron sailors, when the Lasers are capsizing a lot Mark Roe & Gordon de Sousa hold their boats upright; in medium winds Tony Ogborn and Rupert Keep are extremely

competitive. The results are all posted onto the PSC website (see <http://www.priorysc.org.uk/pages/results.htm>) but here are the top three places:

Joseph Mullan (Topper) performs brilliantly in all winds but is at his most magnificent in a near gale. Dick Knowles (Vago) flies his gennaker in all winds but can capsize in pretty much any wind also! Sometimes everyone capsizes & recovers, and sometimes the winds are so light it can be hard to reach the start line, let alone finish.

The Portsmouth Yardstick scheme, and the Priory Personal Handicap system allow for a variety of boats, sails and helm abilities, and yet who is the best sailor varies with each race. The personal handicaps are adjusted periodically to reflect success in series. The current top 4 racers in the club judged by their personal handicaps, set after the Icicle Series, are 1. Tony Ogborn (75pts), 2. Rupert Keep (25pts), 3=. Paul Williams and Joseph Mullan (20pts).

To give non-racers the flavour of racing at PSC, a list of the award winners out of the 23 participants in the RNLI Regatta at PSC on 9th June is appended. There were three races, with two to count and qualify for awards. The results show that racing achievements are available in many categories: well done to these awardees!

Non-Members' dinghy sailing and windsurfing courses for Adults

We continue to build on our success from previous years, and are currently offering both dinghy and windsurfing courses for non-members. The purpose of these courses is to give more people the opportunity to take part in sailing and hopefully attract new members to PSC, so we remain a successful, flourishing and buoyant club. Each course has a maximum of 6 people and offers 12 hours sailing. This covers the basics of rigging a boat, getting out on the water, sailing a triangular course and getting back into shore: everything required to be able to sail a boat independently. The course leads to an RYA Level 1 qualification.

We have run two dinghy courses so far this year. The first weekend course in May was very successful and attracted 5 out of the 6 participants to join the club. The second course in June was attended by 3 men who faced challenging winds all weekend but all looked like they were enjoying themselves and were certainly competent in capsized drill!

We are very keen to attract new members, and are especially keen to get more ladies out on the water. If you know anyone who would be interested please do let them know about the range of courses we offer. Alternatively if you have any contacts/ideas we could use for marketing or indeed would like to be involved in promoting the club then please let me know.

Feel free to make other suggestions to make Telltales as relevant, informative and entertaining as possible.


